AVAILABLE ONLINE MARCH 1, 2025

TO REGISTER for Kindergarten or Young 5's children must be 5 years of age on or before September 1, 2025 to attend for the 2025/2026 school year.

Parents of children turning 5 between September 1st and December 1st, 2025 may submit online registration, Allendale Public Schools will make every effort to consider your child's registration.

☆ REGISTRATION DOCUMENTS NEEDED: ☆

- 1. Birth certificate (county issued) (original or copy)
- 2. Proof of residency (utility bill, lease/mortgage work best)
- 3. Complete up to date official immunization record or valid waiver (DPT, Polio, MMR, Varicella, Hep B)
- 4. Health appraisal form completed and signed by a physician dated 2024 or newer
- 5. Proof of vision, hearing and dental screening

The above items are not required at the time of registration, but must be provided BEFORE your child can attend school.

Free hearing vision and dental screenings are available for students entering kindergarten (or Young 5's) through the Ottawa County Department of Public Health.



Middle School Happenings

RAIL Project Update: Exploring Biodiversity Through Salmon and Macroinvertebrates



In 6th grade science, we're excited to continue partnering on the RAIL Project with the Michigan DNR's Salmon in the Classroom Program for the third year. Currently, our Chinook salmon are in the alevin stage, relying on their yolk sacs for nutrients as they grow. These young salmon provide a unique opportunity to study how their introduction into local ecosystems may influence aquatic biodiversity. Later this spring, we will release the salmon into the Sevey Drain, continuing their journey in the wild.

This project ties directly into our RAIL Project, where we investigate the impact of Chinook salmon on the abundance and diversity of aquatic macroinvertebrates in the Sevey Drain. Macroinvertebrates—such as scuds, mayflies, caddisflies, aquatic beetles, etc.—are vital to stream ecosystems. They serve as indicators of water quality and stream metabolism and are a primary food source for salmon during their fry and smolt stages.


Our driving question this year builds on our previous year's research:

How does the introduction of Chinook salmon as a new predator affect the macroinvertebrate community and the overall ecological health of the Sevey Drain?

Through this investigation, students are exploring key ecological concepts, including:

- The predator-prey relationship between salmon and macroinvertebrates.
- How changes in macroinvertebrate populations might alter water quality and ecosystem balance.
- Scientific methods to measure biodiversity and assess stream health. By studying these interactions, our students gain firsthand insights into the dynamic relationships within ecosystems and the critical role biodiversity plays in maintaining ecological health.




Emily Karchon Speech and Language Pathologist
