This is Evergreen's personal electronic devices policy, which is aligned for consistency across the K-8 buildings, states:

"Evergreen students will not be permitted to have personal electronic devices out during the school day, including cell phones, smartwatches, and tablets, among others. Preferably, these items would remain at home, however, if a student brings a device, it should be turned off and left in their backpack during school hours. If personal electronic devices are observed by staff they may be confiscated and turned in to the office. Parents will then be asked to make arrangements with the office to pick up the device."
