Michigan Virtual School Online Courses

The Michigan Virtual School is an online way for students to take elective and AP courses not offered at AHS. Online courses are a very independent means of learning. A student must be very self-disciplined, motivated, and organized to be successful in these courses. There is an instructor for these courses but communication with them is through email or phone. A student should expect to put at least 7-10 hours of work per week into these courses. Students will be located in a room in the high school to be able to work on the class during their assigned class time. Students will have access to these courses wherever they have internet access, so they should expect to work on them at home. The school will cover the cost of these courses as long as they are successfully completed by the student. * 2 credits of a World Language are required for graduation. If Spanish 1 is being successfully completed in 8th grade, it is recommended to complete your second year of your world language requirement (Spanish 2) in 9th grade. The 2nd credit of the World Language requirement can also be replaced with credit earned in a CTE program or an extra credit in the Visual, Performing, or Applied Arts (VPAA) area.

* If you took Algebra 1 in 8th grade and didn't earn a C+ or better, you should be taking Algebra 1 again in 9th grade to help you be successful in Algebra 2 and Geometry.

* Band or Choir can be fit in by pushing Physical Education and Health to 10th grade.

* Students will be taking 6 classes per semester equaling 12 total semester long classes for a total of 6 credits.

How do you know students will choose the correct classes?

High school counselors will email out registration materials to all 8th grade students and parents. High school counselors will meet with 8th graders at the middle school to introduce graduation requirements, high school course choices, and how to enter course requests into their student portal of Infinite Campus. Students must print a copy of their course requests, get a parent signature, and then return to a middle school teacher who will get the signature page to the high school counselors. The high school counselors will double check all requests for accuracy.

What if my child has a different teacher for the second part of a class?

Factors like class availability, the number of sections in a given class, and class size do not always allow students to have the same teacher in both semesters. Our teachers that teach the same class, work together to stay on the same pace and use common assessments for the students.

Will my child get everything on his/her schedule that he/she requested? What if he/she doesn't?

Students will get the required classes for each grade. Some students will not get all of their elective choices due to class availability or course conflicts. When course conflicts arise, alternate courses will be used as a supplement or students will be contacted to choose another class.

How will students know which lunch they are assigned?

Lunch is determined by the students' 4th period class. Your child's 4th period teacher will be assigned either Lunch A or Lunch B. This will be your child's lunch time as well. This will show on their schedule. Students do not choose their lunch.

What if I want to request a teacher for my child?

You are welcome to make a request; however, it is not always possible to honor a request because of class size and balance, class availability, and schedule conflicts with other classes.

When will my child receive his/her schedule for next year?

Your child will receive his/her 9th grade schedule in August. The pick-up day will be sent to you over the summer through the mail. The school will be open on this day and there will be an opportunity at this time to find classrooms, lockers, etc.

What if I want my child to test out of a class?

AHS has a testing out window during the summer. In the spring a testing out request form will be emailed out to students/parents. Then based on these forms, teachers will put together study materials to be picked up by the students before leaving school for the summer. Students will then take an assessment on a determined date in August to determine credit or no credit for the class. A C+ or better must be earned on the assessment to be awarded credit. If credit is earned, counselors will adjust schedules as needed.

What is the best way to stay informed?

Make sure the high school has your updated email address on file. Most information is communicated via email. Keep an eye on the Allendale High School website.
